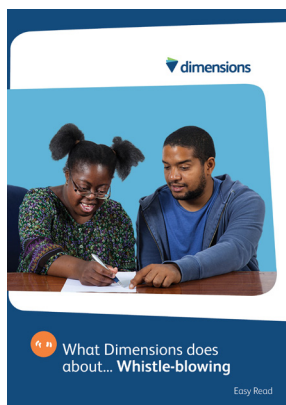

## About these booklets



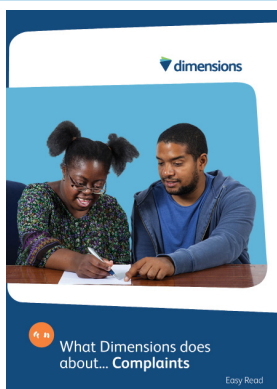
The **What Dimensions does about...** booklets talk about the rules that the staff at Dimensions should be following in simple words and pictures.

## Thinking about whistle-blowing



**Whistle-blowing** is when a somebody tells a person in charge about something bad going on.



Often, it is a member of staff who is doing this bad thing. It may even be a manager.



We want everybody who works for Dimensions to know that it's good to speak up when something bad is going on.



We call the person who speaks up a **whistle-blower**.



## Thinking about whistle-blowing



We know it's not always easy to speak up. So we have a **whistle-blowing** hotline. This is a phone number you can call any time of day or night to report bad things.

This service is confidential. This means that you do not have to give your name. But the person you speak to will tell Rhoda Iranloye all about the problem.



Rhoda is the **Group Director of Regulatory Assurance** for Dimensions.



Rhoda will make sure we investigate the problem.

The Care Quality Commission/Care Inspectorate Wales

Sometimes, to fix a problem we will have to share the name of the whistle-blower. When this happens, we will do all we can to protect them. This means keeping them safe from the person they have reported.
